Prostate Testing



There has been very significant progress this month on our plans for the 2025 PSA testing programme. We are now able to confirm that the next test session will take place at the Abraham Darby Academy in Madeley on 8th March 2025. We have 312 test slots available at that event and, as for all our recent test events, prior booking is essential.

There will be no mandatory charge for these tests, but we do rely very heavily on donations to enable us to maintain our test programme. Each test costs our club around £28 - a total of almost £9000 for this event. So, as for previous years, we will be inviting those tested to make a donation on the day.

Supporting YMCA



We have considerable admiration for the work that the YMCA does in providing supported housing to young people aged 16-25 who are homeless or have a housing need. Their tenants often come from extremely chaotic situations and the goal is to provide support and opportunities for them to start afresh

And Maninplace



Another outing for Pam and Sam, this time to deliver a donation of food to Maninplace - a local organisation providing supported emergency and longer-term accommodation for people rough sleeping or homeless in the borough of Telford and Wrekin

Established in 2006 as a not-for-profit community enterprise, Maninplace set out to provide accommodation for those who were unable to access social housing and private sector rental properties due to limited income and lifestyle. It is a great local cause which we are proud to support.

And Telford crisis Support

Until very recently the provision of food support was essentially a pre-Christmas activity for our Lions club; more recently it has become a year-round programme. This year we delivered 82 bags of food through Telford-based charity organisations between April and July.

With winter approaching the need for food support increases very significantly and as we noted in last month's newsletter, we will again be aiming to collect over 4 tonnes of food for distribution over the Christmas period.

Our club has had a very long-standing relationship with St Georges School and we were saddened recently to receive a support request from the school for the family of one of their very young pupils. The request read as follows:

"She is a beautiful member of our school community, who at the age of 6, is already known by so many for being a delight. She is a member of a lovely, caring, supportive family with 2 older siblings and 1 younger, all who are part of the St. George's family. Sadly, during the summer holidays, she became unwell, and within a very short period of time was diagnosed with Rhabdomyosarcoma... a very rare and

complicated stomach cancer. She is now and will be for many months to come, being treated in Birmingham Children's Hospital.

The impact emotionally, logistically and financially on this family is huge, as you can imagine. As you will understand, there is a huge financial burden created by travelling to Birmingham daily, along with loss of pay from employment. Therefore, I am asking, if there is anything that Ironbridge Lions could do to assist this family in need."

The club made an immediate support donation through the School but this is a family which is going to need support and assistance for some considerable time. We will of course endeavour to maintain support and to report progress in future editions of this newsletter.
